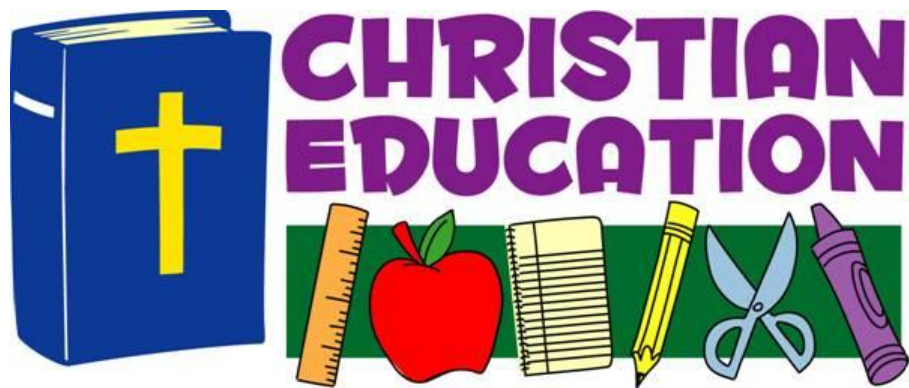

Church School Mission Statement and Responsibilities

The Mission of the Christian Education & Discipleship Committee is to develop and supervise the church school and educational program of the church. It will provide for the growth and discipleship of church members and for their equipment for ministry.

The term Faith & Discipleship will normally be used to describe Church School / Sunday School.

Among the regular responsibilities of the Christian Education & Discipleship Committee:

1. Oversees Church School (Staffing, Resources, Education Space)
2. Oversees Vacation Bible School (Staffing and Resources)
3. Serves as Adult Discipleship, Communicants Liaison
4. Oversees Discipleship of Congregation
5. Manages Church School Superintendent

Curriculum/Lessons

All curriculums used in our Christian Education classes are approved by the Session. They are reviewed for theological content, appropriateness for grade level, teachability, ability to engage students, and overall mood. The goal of our entire curriculum is to build our students into the body of Christ by offering fun, challenging, and interesting classes that promote Christian maturity and encourage missions.

Attendance

The educational and spiritual benefits of our Faith & Discipleship program are dependent on the presence of the student for continuity of instruction and participation. We understand that there are presently many demands of our time even on Sundays, but we hope to realize a substantial commitment to attend Faith & Discipleship as regularly as possible. To encourage continuous attendance, the Christian Education & Discipleship Committee has instituted a perfect attendance award program. Students who have perfect

attendance in their Faith & Discipleship Class will be recognized with a perfect attendance award.

If a student is planning to be absent from a Faith & Discipleship class (if, for example, he or she is on vacation) and attends worship at another church, the student may bring the worship bulletin from that church. The student will not be counted as absent.

Worship

Christian Education is but one component of following Christ. The Christian Education Committee strongly encourages all Faith & Discipleship students and their parents to attend worship.

Grade-Level Goals

The Christian Education and Discipleship Committee has compiled a list of age-appropriate learning goals for the students to work on during the year. The teachers will incorporate these goals into their classes, but the students are encouraged to learn them on their own as well. The achievement of these goals each year will help to provide the basic building blocks for a faith-filled foundation in life.

Pre-K: The Golden Rule (Matthew 7:12)

“Do to others what you would have them do to you.”

First Grade: The Ten Commandments (Exodus 20: 3-17)

1. You shall have no other gods before Me.
2. You shall not make for yourself an idol in the form of anything.
3. You shall not misuse the name of the Lord your God.
4. Remember the Sabbath day by keeping it holy.
5. Honor your father and mother.
6. You shall not murder.
7. You shall not commit adultery.
8. You shall not steal.

9. You shall not lie.
10. You shall not want for yourself what your neighbor owns.

Second Grade: The Lord's Prayer

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy name. Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Third Grade: The Apostles' Creed

Mission/Service Projects

Each year the entire Faith & Discipleship participates in various mission projects. The purpose of these projects is to encourage each student to participate in the mission of the larger church and to consider the vast mission field. Examples of these mission projects are the One Great Hour of Sharing Offering, a Mitten Tree, etc. Teachers may also provide other approved service opportunities to their classes on an individual basis.

Faith & Discipleship Offering

An offering is collected for Faith & Discipleship during the opening assembly each morning. The collection is intended to teach the importance of Christian stewardship in the lives of all God's people, including our young disciples.

Discipline in the Classroom

The approach to classroom management and discipline at New Bethlehem Church is guided by an overall objective of showing the children how to work together in Christian community, supporting and respecting each other in our faith journey.

The Session adopted the following policy for Faith & Discipleship, Nursery during Sunday Worship Services and Vacation Bible School:

1. Children shall keep their hands to themselves and use only kind words.
2. Any child who is aggressive and violent toward others; or uses language that is profane or otherwise unacceptable, may be removed from the class for that day and the child's parent(s) will be notified. The child will be welcome to return to the class when it next meets or when the behavior has been corrected.

In the event that a child is removed from his or her class group, the pastor and/or clerk of session will be notified as soon as possible.

Students are Expected to:

- ❖ Arrive for the F&D opening assembly on time (9:40am).
- ❖ Be respectful of others in class, both peers and leaders.
- ❖ Speak in turn so that only one person talks at a time and listen when others speak.
- ❖ Participate fully in class with fun and fellowship.
- ❖ Be respectful of classroom materials.
- ❖ Turn off cell phones or leave them at home.

Teachers are Expected to:

- ❖ Use a curriculum that has been approved by the Session.
- ❖ Arrive for the F&D opening assembly on time (9:40am).
- ❖ Prepare the weekly Faith & Discipleship class lesson in advance.

- ❖ Track student attendance.
- ❖ Teach the Grade-Level Goals.
- ❖ Serve as a Christian role model for the students.
- ❖ Be clear and consistent about expected behavior.

Assistants are Expected to:

- ❖ Be prepared in the event that the teacher is going to be absent.
- ❖ Be friendly to everyone in class.
- ❖ Be ready to observe, participate or assist as teacher directs.
- ❖ Accompany students Grade 2 and under to the restroom (wait outside).

Parents/Guardians are Expected to:

- ❖ Make sure children/youth understand what is expected of them at Church.
- ❖ Encourage children/youth to attend consistently by example.
- ❖ Play an active role in the Christian Education of their children.
- ❖ Pick up children Nursery-2nd Grade in classrooms at dismissal of worship.
